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Purpose

The Education program provides the first two years of a guided pathway for students interested in completing a four-year college or university degree, with licensure to teach. This curriculum provides general education in a program leading to a career at the kindergarten, elementary, middle school, and/or secondary levels.

After successfully completing the first two years at DSLCC, the student will be transferready for entry into the third year of a four-year college or university to prepare the student to teach in a selected educational setting. The program takes four semesters or two years of full-time study to complete.

Admission Requirements

Students who meet the admission requirements to the College are eligible for enrollment into the program. Individuals are expected to be proficient in basic English, mathematics and reading. Appropriate developmental courses are available for those who need to update their skills.

Program Description

Students who successfully complete this program will be ready to transfer to prepare for a career in elementary, middle or secondary education.

Employment Outlook

Education positions will grow 12 percent through 2021 according to the Bureau of Labor Statistics. Numbers of openings will vary by region, reflecting differences in population growth, student-teacher ratio and budgets.
